As part of the overall development cooperation and direct engagement, the Embassy further manages a micro-project fund aiming at the specific support of small-size projects that directly contribute to poverty alleviation and the improvement of living standards as well as covering the basic needs of the poorest social classes.



Who we are

The Chimfunshi Wildlife Orphanage Trust (CWOT) was established in 1983 and is recognized as one of the largest chimpanzee sanctuaries in the world. Located in Zambia, CWOT spans over 10,000 hectares of Miombo forest along the Upper Kafue River which is Zambia's second largest river. In the northern Copperbelt region, CWOT provides a safe haven for over 150 endangered chimpanzees and other wildlife in need. These animals are rescued and rehabilitated in suitable semi-free-range enclosures.

But CWOT is more than a sanctuary: The vision of CWOT is an integrated landscape management approach to serve as a sustainable model for Miombo forest management in rural Zambia. This approach includes CWOT leading the way in reducing wildlife trafficking, promoting sustainable local development, developing a fair and inclusive rural society, and ensuring that biodiversity and ecosystems provide essential services to the community. This vision aims to improve well-being and prosperity and contribute to the achievement of national and global sustainable development goals.

Today, around 70 employees and their families (around 400 people in total including around 130children) live on site at CWOT. In addition to providing employment opportunities, CWOT offers comprehensive education and training programmes, comfortable housing with access to water and electricity, and basic medical services for all residents through a community clinic.





What we do

The work of the Chimfunshi Wildlife Orphanage Trust encompasses a wide range of activities that not only focus on the welfare of the chimpanzees, but also make an important contribution to the local community and environment:

- Rescue, rehabilitation and care of chimpanzees and local wildlife. CWOT provides a safe environment for these animals to recover and live in conditions that closely resemble their natural habitat.
- Community development. This includes building homes for the employees and their families, creating jobs and ensuring reliable access to electricity and clean water.
- Education. CWOT founded and operate the Twampane Community School, which provides a preschool and primary and secondary education to over 230 local children. In addition to classrooms, there is now a library and a playground. The pupils also receive a hot meal every day.
- Healthcare is supported through the establishment and operation of a health post. This clinic provides essential medical services to the Chimfunshi community and improves the overall well-being of the residents and staff.
- Protection and reforestation of the Miombo forest, an important ecosystem in the region. By planting trees and protecting existing forests, CWOT aims to restore this unique landscape, which is home to a variety of species.
- Protecting the water and wetlands along the neighbouring Kafue River. This river is vital to the biodiversity of the region and by protecting its water quality and the surrounding wetlands, CWOT is helping to maintain the natural balance of the ecosystem. The work ensures that both wildlife and local communities can continue to rely on this important water source.
- Smart farming and cattle breeding. By introducing modern agricultural practices, such as the use of solar-powered irrigation systems and sustainable farming methods, CWOT is helping the local community to increase their agricultural productivity. This not only contributes to food security, but also creates income opportunities for local families.
- Promoting eco-tourism and conservation education programmes. Through the development of these programmes and the construction of an education centre, CWOT offers school classes and visitors the opportunity to learn about conservation and the importance of protecting the environment.

What we do

FZS supports the North Luangwa (NLCP) and the Nsumbu Tanganyika Conservation Programmes (NTCP), in partnership with the Department of National Parks and Wildlife (DNPW) and their associated Community Resource Boards (CRB), in all aspects of the conservation and management of the respective protected area, totalling >29,000km².

Who we are

Fountain Gate Crafts & Trade School is a craft and trades training school registered and accredited by the Technical Educational Vocational Entrepreneurship Training Authority. The school was founded in 2019 as a follow up to the pilot project In Dual Vocational Training by the Chamber of Skilled Crafts Frankfurt Rhein-Main funded by BMZ. The school commenced trainings in May 2022 and focuses on construction trades and renewable energy training and aims to involve Industry back into training, thereby improving the quality and intensity of the training.

What we do

- Regular TEVET trainings: The school currently trains in bricklaying & masonry, electrical technology, plumbing and pipe fitting, and skills in installation of solar energy applications, all these under the TEVETA Curricular.
- **Community Trainings**: The school also conducts community trainings aimed at empowering local communities. In 2023 the school training 19 women from the local community in basic electrical skills.
- **School Outreach:** In 2024 the school has hosted 72 primary and secondary school children and gave them an experience of a solar day where they explored various applications and uses of solar energy.
- **Training of Trainers: Green Peoples Energy:** In 2022, as part of the Green Peoples Energy project to train 260 solar installers, Fountain Gate trained 16 lecturers from government Vocational Training Institutes in the skills Award of Installation of Solar energy applications.
- Solar Cooling: European Energy Partnerships: The school undertook The Solar Cooling project in conjunction with ID Solar, Phaesun and Solar Cooling Engineering, and supported by the European Energy Partnership. The aim was to promote the use of solar technology for cooling in the agriculture value chain.
- Blended Training and RPL: Currently the school is undertaking a project: Empowering communities through Blended training skills in installation of solar energy applications and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). This is supported by GIZ under a Local Subsidy. The training has an enrolment of 90 and aims to empower communities by making the trainings online and on-site.
